

**Shady Banks Civic Association  
Minutes of General Meeting – April 16, 2008  
Meeting Held in the Hortt School Conference Trailer**

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 PM by President Barbara Haggerty. Approximately 20 Shady Banks residents were present for this meeting. Board members present were Barb Haggerty, Kay Buckland, Marilyn Israel, Dave Clancy, Bill Purswell, Rose Purswell and Robert Moore.

Secretary Dave Clancy presented the minutes of the March special board meeting and they were approved.

Treasurer Kay Buckland presented a Treasurer's Report. Our current bank balance is \$6,438.39 and we have 80 paid memberships for 2008.

Capt. Kevin Sheehan of FLPD and another police officer were present to give us a police report. Capt. Sheehan reported that crime statistics for Shady Banks have been relatively low in recent months. Per President Haggerty's request, he next discussed our neighborhood graffiti problem. He suggested that neighbors be watchful, report any incidents to the police and get descriptions of the perpetrators if possible. He said that the FLPD is now doing nightly patrols of Hortt Park and the Bill Keith Preserve. Mike Chamberlain reported that most of the graffiti and other vandalism problems seem to be happening on weekends.

Next, Terry Rynard of the City's Parks & Recreation Department talked to the group about the Bill Keith Preserve and the removal of non-native trees. Following Terry's presentation, Megan Gibney of the Broward County Environmental Protection Department (EPD) explained the details of the State's program on non-native tree removal. Megan and Terry told us that as the non-natives are removed, new trees will be planted. Grant money will be used to supply the new trees, and Parks & Rec personnel and neighborhood volunteers will plant and maintain them.

Next, Waterworks on-site inspector Clyde Harding gave the group a brief update on the sewer construction project. He reported that the "orphans" area will be ready for hookup soon, but that the rest of Sewer Basin C will have to wait until September or later to hookup. Clyde reported that Waterworks now has a neighborhood field office in a rented house at 1601 SW 13<sup>th</sup> Court. The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.
